

Liturgy and Life

Unfortunately, our depictions of Jesus' crucifixion sometimes make it look more like a romanticized drama than the brutal execution it was. Crucifixion was the prescribed form of execution for slaves and non-Roman citizens: it's cruelty was a sign to others of the same class to behave, lest the same thing happen to them, Despite the fact that the person Christians acclaim as Savior was a victim of capital punishment, despite the fact that popes and the US Bishops have condemned it, capital punishment remains legal in 27 US states (as of 2023). The United States is one of the few industrialized nations that still practice it. Capital punishment is even (outrageously) given biblical warrant by some Christians. Such argumentation is not worthy of Christians, called to forgive seventy times seven times! Explore how you and your parishioners can get involved in the Catholic Mobilizing Network, a national organization that works with the USCCB to end the death penalty.




