HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION MONDAY, DECEMBER 9TH MASS: 8:30AM & 6:30PM

The United States Conference of Bishops (USCCB) Committee on Canonical Affairs has issued modifications regarding the celebration of the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Patronal Feast Day of the United States. Because the December 8 feast day coincides with the 2nd Sunday of Advent, it was originally transferred to Monday, December 9th, and the requirement to attend Mass was initially lifted. However, recent updates from the USCCB this October indicated that the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception on Monday, December 9, 2024 will now be recognized as a holy day of obligation and all are obliged to participate in Mass.


