John the Baptist was a wild man. Clothed in camel's hair and eating locusts, John did not look like your typical religious leader. What lessons get lost amid such judgment? Next time you see someone asking for money or carrying bags of their belongings, stop. Listen. Consider how this person could be preparing the way.
