

LOW GLUTEN COMMUNION

At St. Thomas the Apostle Church we seek to provide a welcoming and comfortable atmosphere for all of our parishioners and guests. We are aware that there are some individuals that have special dietary restrictions that require them to entirely eliminate gluten from their diets.

We are pleased to announce the availability of Gluten-Free hosts at every weekend Mass celebration. These hosts are approved for use in the Catholic Mass and have a low enough gluten content as to be certified as Gluten Free* by the FDA. Any parishioners looking to receive Gluten Free at Communion, please notify the sacristan serving Mass. Communion will be distributed on the Baptismal Font side of the church out of a Low Gluten PYX, please seat yourself accordingly and look for the Sacristan with the Pyx as you come forward for Communion.

*Gluten-Free is defined by the FDA as having a gluten limit of less than 20 parts per million (ppm). Cavanagh, our supplier of Gluten-Free hosts, provides low gluten wafers that are approved for use in the Catholic Mass by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. They are made of wheat starch and water. The gluten content of our low gluten free wafer is below 20 parts per million. The baking of the low gluten wafers is done in a dedicated bakery using positive air pressure to create a room that is totally free of contaminants. The equipment is also dedicated to the low gluten baking and is not used for regular altar bread production.

Federal In March 2021. The Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) announced a new program to provide financial assistance to families for certain COVID-19-related funeral expenses incurred due to a COVID-19-related death. FEMA began accepting applications for Funeral Assistance on April 12, 2021 through a dedicated call center. The telephone number for the FEMA Funeral Assistance Program is 844-684-6333 | TTY: 800-462-7585. Hours of operation are Monday through Friday 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. eastern time.

To apply you must call FEMA, there is no online application. The person applying must be the individual who incurred the funeral expense for the deceased. FEMA asks that you have all documentation in hand before calling. UNITED STATES BANKRUPTCY COURT FOR THE DISTRICT OF NEW JERSEY In re The Diocese of Camden, New Jersey Case No. 20-21257 (JNP)

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE THAT on October 1, 2020, The Diocese of Camden, New Jersey, (the "<u>Diocese</u>") filed for protection under Chapter 11 of Title 11 of the United States Code.

The Bankruptcy Court has established June 30, 2021 at 11:59 p.m. (prevailing Eastern time) as the deadline to file proofs of claim against the Diocese (the "<u>Bar Date</u>").

If you have a claim against the Diocese including, without limitation, <u>a</u> <u>claim related to sexual abuse committed by any person connected with</u> <u>the Diocese</u>, you must file a claim on or before the Bar Date with Prime Clerk, the appointed Claims Agent.

IF YOU DO NOT TIMELY FILE A PROOF OF CLAIM, YOU MAY FORFEIT YOUR RIGHT TO VOTE ON ANY PLAN OF REORGANIZATION AND TO SHARE IN ANY DISTRIBUTIONS TO CREDITORS IN CONNECTION WITH THE DIOCESE'S CHAPTER 11 CASE.



STATEMENT OF THE NEW JERSEY BISHOPS *Reinstating the General Obligation to Attend Mass*

At this time, due to the observance of public safety protocols and the increase in the availability of vaccines, we have begun a return to some sense of normalcy in various sectors of our society.

Therefore, we the Catholic Bishops of New Jersey, are lifting the dispensation of the Sunday and Holy Days Mass obligation beginning on Saturday, June 5, 2021, and Sunday, June 6, 2021, Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. We welcome the Christian faithful to return to the regular participation in the Sunday Eucharist, the source and summit of our Catholic faith (cf. Code of Canon Law canon 1247 and Catechism of the Catholic Church, n. 2180).

This obligation does not apply to those who are ill; those who have reason to believe that they were recently exposed to the coronavirus or another serious or contagious illness; those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility; or those with serious underlying health conditions. One should consult the local pastor if questions arise about the obligation to attend Mass (canon 87).

Finally, safety protocols (such as wearing masks, social distancing, etc.) and liturgical directives (communion in the hand, communion under one species, etc.) in each New Jersey Diocese remains in place until modified or revoked by the respective Diocesan Bishop.
