Read paragraph 4 of Pope Francis' statement for World Day of Peace, 2015, "No Longer Slaves, but Brothers and Sisters." The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops operates an anti-trafficking program that includes the Amistad Movement, named after the Amistad slave ship, site of an 1839 revolt that eventually resulted in freedom for the Africans who had been seized. The movement offers awareness programs and training to immigrants to help them avoid being trafficking victims.
